Coaches in the Spotlight

In order to get to know our dedicated coaches a little better, in this edition we asked coaches Yuan-Qin Leong and Samantha Li some "burning" questions.



Coach Yuan-Qin Leong

Yuan-Qin has been coaching at Sunset for 6 years. Yuan-Qin was also Jennifer's student when she skated competitively.

At what age did you start skating and where?

I started skating when I was four years old in Kitimat, BC. At that time, my aunt babysat me, so I was enrolled into skating along with my sister and cousins. I don't remember much, but I do remember crying and being the lowest one on the ice.

What do YOU think is your greatest skating achievement?

My greatest skating achievement was coming second at Singapore Nationals in 2010 at the Novice level. It was my second time attending

Singapore Nationals and that year, the competition was held in Malaysia. I'm most proud of this achievement because I was able to put out a good skate and handle the competition without my coach being there.

What is your favourite skating jump and why?

My favorite jump is the double Axel. It is the most memorable jump for me, because I can still remember when I first landed it on an open session at Sunset during my lesson with Jennifer. Although I cannot land the jump anymore, for some reason my body is less afraid of attempting them compared to a double Lutz.

What is your coaching philosophy?

My coaching philosophy is to create challenging lessons, while balancing a fun environment to achieve the skater's personal goals; whether the skater is interested in competitive skating or recreational skating. As a coach who has been coaching for just over 6 years, I think the most challenging part is getting the skater to recognize their strengths and capabilities.

Tell us something we don't know about you.

One of my New Year's resolutions that I have been keeping up with this year is journaling. There's something different about writing down goals and aspirations compared to saying them or keeping them in the back of my mind. Every week, I jot down a couple of notes on my weekly win, what I'm grateful for, and at the end of the month I like to reflect on what I've learned, my achievements, and what I want to focus on for the next month. When I was growing up my parents encouraged me to journal and set goals. On the first day of the New Year, my family would sit down and share our successes from the past year and what we aim to achieve in the New Year.

What is your favourite App?

My favorite App is Spotify because I don't think I can live without music. I love how the app has various playlists to choose from. My favorite part about the app is the Discover Weekly Playlist, as it introduces me to new songs that I might like.



Coach Samantha Li

Samantha has been coaching at Sunset for 7 years. You will find her at the rink coaching the CanSkate, StarSkate and Competitive programs.

At what age did you start skating and where?

I started skating at the age of eight at Sunset. I was in the Sunset Canskate program, JD and then started competing with Sunset. Now I coach Sunset SC!

What do YOU think is your greatest skating achievement?

I think my greatest skating achievement was never failing any tests (Freeskate, Dance, or Skating skills)

What is your favorite skating jump and why?

My favorite jump would be the Flip. I think it is my favorite jump because with correct technique and speed you can get so much height in a flip jump.

What is your coaching philosophy?

I want to teach my skaters that hard work, determination, and positive thinking translates not only into their skating but also into everything they do in life. Moreover, if you fall down, you get up and do it again. Therefore, my coaching philosophy is to go beyond coaching skating, I want my skaters to thrive as individuals.

Tell us something we don't know about you.

A former coach of mine used to teach us yoga and I loved doing yoga ever since then.

What is your favorite App?

Google Calendar. It helps me stay organized and remind me of things I need to do during the day.

Congratulations Amy!

Amy Shao Ning Yang, set a **new Canadian record** by winning the Novice competition at the 2020 Canadian Tire National Skating Championship in Mississauga, Ontario. This was Amy's first trip to the Canadian National Skating competition. Amy finished with 144.71 points for the short and free programs combined. Amy is also the recipient of the Toller Cranston Memorial Fund Athlete award for her on-ice artistic presence at the Canadian Nationals.

Shortly after her National victory, Amy and Jennifer travelled to Obertsdorf, Germany, with the Canadian team to represent Canada at the Bavarian Open. Amy won the Advanced Novice Level Group 2 competition.






Amy shared her experiences from both competitions with us. "I was happy with my performance at Canadians in general. It reflected my training and it bought me a ticket to my first international competition. I was very excited to be able to represent Canada at the Bavarian Open in Germany. There were a lot of new experiences: the long trip to Germany with the team; being at a competition without my mom for the first time; sharing a hotel room with my teammate. Although I was not satisfied with my performances, I was so happy to be on the ice competing at my first international event! A 'Big Thank You' to my friends, my coaches and everyone at Sunset SC for their love and support throughout the season!"

B.C Winter Games

The B.C. Winter Games are held every two years in different cities around British Columbia. Athletes from across the province are selected to compete at the games. The 2020 B.C Winter Games were held in Fort St. John, B.C. between February 20 -23, 2020. Sunset skaters Bella Han and Anthony Lu were selected to compete at the Winter Games this year. Bella and Anthony, together with Sunset coaches Yuan-Qin Leong and Mitchell Gordon travelled by plane to Fort St. John. Bella won the Juvenile competition and Anthony won the Special O Level 3 Men's competition.





Bella shared her experiences at the Winter Games: B.C Games 2020 in Fort St. John was an unforgettable moment for me. It was the first time I traveled without my parents and participated in a multi-sport event. I felt free! I made many friends, and experienced waking up at times that I wasn't used to. I really enjoyed my time for the first few days, just chilling around with my new friends. All the practices went well, and I felt I was ready for this. However, during the actual competition warmup, I felt worried and a bit nervous, but I also want to win this competition, because it was really special for me, and I did not want to leave disappointed. After I

finished my competition, I could not believe I got a medal! That was overwhelming for me, all the happy thoughts came to me, everything. Not only feeling happy for me but zone 5 and Sunset. Everyone makes mistakes, but try your best, and you will eventually succeed."

Coach Yuan-Qin shared her experience at the Winter Games: "Last month I had the amazing opportunity to attend the BC Winter Games in Fort St. Johns. I really enjoyed connecting with the other coaches and skaters. Although we only had one skater representing Sunset, Bella, it was a memorable competition as she not only won the Juvenile Ladies event, she achieved a personal best score. It was a pleasure to share the success of our coaching team with Mitchell, who also attended the games as a coach. I hope our team of coaches and skaters can continue to work hard, so that more Sunset skaters can have the opportunity to experience the next BC Winter Games in 2022. "

Congratulations to the Sunset Special O Skaters!

The 2020 Special Olympics National Winter Games was held in Thunder Bay, ON in February 2020. Sunset Special Olympic skaters Alex Pang, Tin-Yee Ho and Edmund Lau Sin, together with coaches Jessica Chapelski and Maegan Montemayor represented B.C. at the event. Alex Pang, won two gold medals at the games, one for Dance and the other for the Freeskate. First time national games attendees, Tin-Yee Ho and Edmund Lau Sing won gold in their categories.
